The hours of the shop are Monday and Tuesday is from 7a.m.-5p.m. Wednesday 7a.m.-3p.m. Thursday and Friday is from 7a.m.-5p.m. Saturday is from 8a.m.- 12p.m. and closed on Sundays. Dayna and Adam have hired one other person to work for them. The menu includes coffee, milkshakes, frappuccino, macchiatos and more, the most popular item(s) are milkshakes, frappuccino, and macchiato. The most favorite flavor is caramel. Dayna said that they find some ideas on youtube. Dayna says they are opening a new coffee shop in Plainville but aren't sure quite yet when it'll be up and

running, hopefully by the beginning of next year. "The items on the menu will be the same as the ones in natoma and possibly start selling pastries. World News: California Fires

On Sunday October, 8th the California Fires began. The fires have been one of the most devastating natural disasters in Northern California. The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's estimate of home and structures destroyed was raised to 6,900 from 5,700. Along with these tremendous fires came death.



It has claimed 42 deaths from fires and 22 of the deaths happened in a Sonoma County wildfire, also it has been reported that there are more than 200 people missing. It has been estimated that 217,000 acres have been burned, and approximately 75,000 people have been evacuated. The fires didn't single out any places, but torched high-end homes, middle-class neighborhoods and a mobile home park. Since many of the houses didn't survive, the survivors that did now have a bigger issue: they have nowhere to go.



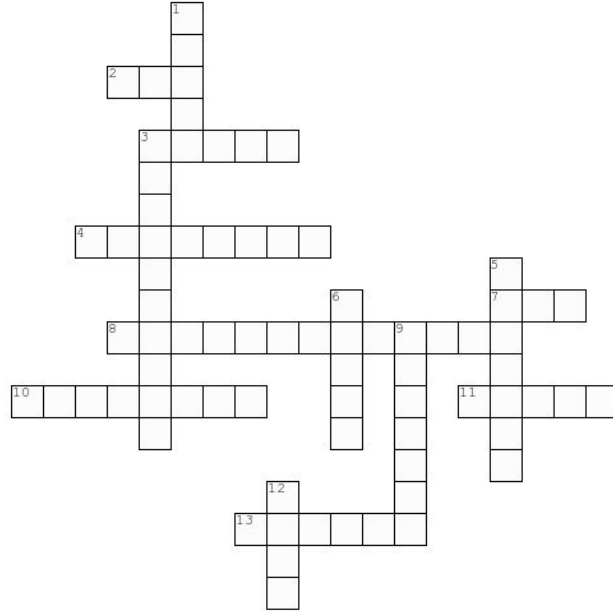
Even though the current fire season has burned the least amount of acres since 2012, it has been declared the worst disaster in California history in terms of homes being destroyed.

Complete the crossword below



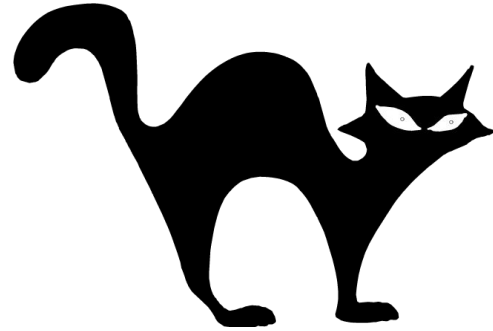
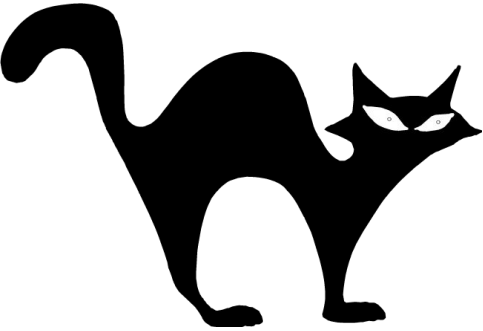
