Trick-or-treaters weren't the only thing that brought terror to New York this Halloween. This past Tuesday, Sayfullo Saipov drove a rented pickup onto a Hudson River biking route, killing eight people and injuring fifteen in under ten minutes. The Isis-inspired terrorist would've continued to brutally mow down pedestrians had he not crashed into a school bus. Several pieces of paper were found in the truck that had Arabic writing on them, all praising Isis and their motives.




